Thailand

BOI-promoted companies subject to the TM.30 notification requirement

Executive summary

Effective 14 May 2025, companies promoted by the Thailand Board of Investment (i.e., BOI-promoted companies) and their foreign employees must include a TM.30 notification receipt for all new, extension and renewal visa applications. Noncompliance with this requirement will result in visa processing delays.

Key developments

The new regulation aligns with Section 38 of Thailand's Immigration Act, which requires hotels, resorts, house owners, landlords and property managers to report the stay of foreign nationals to the Immigration Bureau within 24 hours of their arrival.

The TM.30 notification is an online application submitted by hotels, resorts, house owners, landlords and property managers to the Immigration Bureau via the designated [portal](#). Upon submission, a digital return slip (i.e., the TM.30 notification receipt) is issued and provided to non-Thai nationals, as it is necessary for their immigration-related processes. Previously, BOI-promoted companies were exempt from this notification requirement.

Impact on employers

Employers of impacted individuals may remind their employees to obtain the TM.30 notification receipt from their accommodation hosts to ensure compliance and mitigate business disruptions.
