# India introduces new e-Arrival Card requirement

#### **Executive summary**

Effective 1 October 2025, all foreign nationals entering India are required to apply for an e-Arrival Card within 72 hours prior to arrival, with limited exceptions.

## Key developments

The new requirement applies to all foreign nationals, including those holding regular visas and e-visas. Indian passport holders and Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card holders are exempt from this requirement.

Eligible individuals may apply for the e-Arrival Card through the Indian Visa Online <a href="website">website</a>, the Bureau of Immigration <a href="website">website</a> or the "Su-Swagatam" mobile app by submitting their contact details, passport information, purpose of visit and accommodation details. Upon successful submission, they will receive a digital confirmation (i.e., either a QR code or reference number), which must be presented at the airport, along with their passport.

The e-Arrival Card replaces the paper disembarkation form and is part of broader efforts to streamline immigration clearance and enhance the arrival experience. While the paper form remains available during a six-month transition period, the authorities encourage travelers to use the new online system to benefit from faster immigration processing.

## Impact on employers

Employers may inform the impacted employees about the new requirement to manage employee expectations and mitigate potential business disruptions.
